KINSHIP CARE

Information from the Ohio Resource Guide for Relatives caring for Children:

- ✓ Kinship Caregivers Grandparents, Aunts/Uncles, Cousins, Adult Siblings, and Close Family Friends – are often raising children when parents are unable or unavailable to care for them.
- ✓ Kinship care refers to a temporary or permanent arrangement in which a relative or any non-relative adult who has a long standing relationship or bond with the child and/or family, has taken over the full-time, substitute care of a child.
- ✓ Kinship care includes those relationships established through an informal arrangement, a legal custody order, a relative foster care placement or a kinship placement.
- ✓ Regardless of the type of kinship care arrangement, the kinship caregivers' voluntary commitment to devote their lives to the children in their care is a courageous, life-changing decision.

POSSIBLE NEEDED SUPPORTS

<u>Support</u>: Connect kinship caregivers to resources and services offered in the community.

.

Medical Care: Assistance to families in completing applications for medical coverage.

School: Public school districts require legal paperwork for enrollment. The Kinship Navigator can provide guidance in the enrollment process.

Family Emotions: Children may feel anger, fear, and sadness at any time due to life events. We can help you find the support you need.

Respite: The kinship caregiver may need a break; the kinship support group may create connections for added support when needed.

KINSHIP PERMANENCY INCENTIVE

Kinship Permanency Incentive Program (KPIP) is a program where you may qualify for incentive money after receiving legal custody or guardianship of a child. You are entitled to \$2025 per child for a period of three years. The breakdown is an initial \$525 per child, then \$300 every six months for a total of 36 months. There is an income eligibility for families.



SUPPORT GROUP

A support group has been established for kinship caregivers to share hopes, victories and challenges. We hope families can build support and create strong relationships for support when needed.
